COLORADO

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Anderson Robbins Research (D) and Shaw & Company Research (R).

The poll was conducted by telephone with live interviewers July 9-12, 2016 among a random state sample of 600 Colorado registered voters.

Results for the full sample have a margin of error of plus or minus four percentage points.

Landline (246) and cellphone (354) numbers were randomly selected from a statewide voter file of registered Colorado voters using a probability proportionate to size method. This simply means phone numbers are proportionally representative to the number of voters in all regions across the state of Colorado. Fieldwork conducted by Braun Research, Inc. of Princeton, NJ.

The poll also includes additional interviews (an oversample) of 30 randomly selected Hispanic voters to allow for analysis of the subgroup. The additional interviews were weighted so Hispanics are not over-represented in the overall statewide results. Bi-lingual interviewers were utilized when language barriers were encountered.

An asterisk (*) is used for percentages of less than one-half percent.

A dash (-) represents a value of zero.

Some results may not add to 100% due to rounding.
