All results are for release after 6:00PM/ET Wednesday, October 7, 2020.

## Methodology

Interviews were conducted October 3-6, 2020 among a random national sample of 1,107 registered voters (RV). Landline (239) and cellphone (868) telephone numbers were randomly selected for inclusion in the survey using a probability proportionate to size method, which means phone numbers for each state are proportional to the number of voters in each state.

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of $\pm 3$ percentage points.
A subsample of 1,012 has been defined as likely voters (LV), with a margin of error of $\pm 3$ percentage points.

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Beacon Research (D) (formerly known as Anderson Robbins Research) and Shaw \& Company Research (R).

Fox News Polls before 2011 were conducted by Opinion Dynamics Corporation.

Results are of registered voters, unless otherwise noted.
An asterisk (*) is used for percentages of less than one-half percent. A dash (-) represents a value of zero.
Some percentages may not add to $100 \%$ due to rounding. In the same way, percentages in "total" columns may be one point more or less than the sum of their parts due to rounding.
