# FOX NEWS POLL

Questions 1-8, 13-24, and 45-51 are for release after 6:00 PM/ET Wednesday, June 23, 2021. All other questions are held for future release.

#### Methodology

Interviews were conducted June 19-22, 2021 among a random national sample of 1,001 registered voters (RV). Landline (162) and cellphone (839) telephone numbers were randomly selected for inclusion in the survey using a probability proportionate to size method, which means phone numbers for each state are proportional to the number of voters in each state.

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of  $\pm 3$  percentage points.

The Fox News Poll is conducted under the joint direction of Beacon Research (D) (formerly known as Anderson Robbins Research) and Shaw & Company Research (R).

Fieldwork conducted by Braun Research, Inc. of Princeton, NJ. Fox News Polls before 2011 were conducted by Opinion Dynamics Corporation.
