

On 01/31/19 and 02/04/19 I dated [REDACTED]. On 02/07/19 I was contacted by a [REDACTED] who stated that [REDACTED] is his wife. I confronted [REDACTED] about that statement from [REDACTED] and she stated she and [REDACTED] were never married. I spoke again with [REDACTED] who said that they had been married during a commitment ceremony and that although it's not a marriage recognized by the state of Utah, he and [REDACTED] consider themselves to be married. Finally I spoke again with [REDACTED] who stated that she does not consider herself married to [REDACTED]. Due to my concerns over [REDACTED] and [REDACTED]'s situation, I decided to act only as a friend to [REDACTED] and not date her further until things between her and [REDACTED] were more crystalized.

On 02/09/19 at 2050 hours, while I was off-duty and out of town, I received a call from [REDACTED] [REDACTED] phone number. I answered and said hello, but instead of getting a response I overheard what sounded like [REDACTED] and an adult male engaged in some sort of emotionally charged altercation. I could hear [REDACTED] voice saying "Stop [REDACTED] I need to go to the hospital," and the male voice saying "Let's go. We'll go right now." I heard [REDACTED] voice telling him no and the male voice telling her to "get in, we'll go to the hospital right now." [REDACTED] responded no and told him to please "move" repeatedly. I also heard the adult male telling [REDACTED] he was going to call an ambulance. [REDACTED] was crying and very emotional which was in stark contrast to the male voice, which was overtly measured. Soon the phone hung up and at that point I called Grand County Sheriff's Department dispatch center and relayed the information I'd overheard on the phone call. My phone records calls automatically and so I was able to save the audio from that call.

I soon spoke with responding officers Landon Leavitt of Grand County and Ryan Burraston of Moab PD and forwarded them both the recorded call. I learned through speaking with them and also through follow up communications with [REDACTED] that she'd somehow arrived at Moab Regional Hospital's ER.

Over the following days [REDACTED] relayed to me that she'd been in a domestic dispute with the father of her child, identified as [REDACTED] and that during the dispute he struck her in the head and face repeatedly. She stated that after striking her he began telling her that she'd fallen and hit her head on an ice chest in the garage and suffered a concussion which according to him explained why she had a distorted memory of what had actually taken place. Because my personal cell phone is set up to automatically record calls, I sent a copy of the call to Deputy Leavitt.
