## ORDER PURSUANT TO UNIFORM RULES OF IMPOUNDMENT PROCEDURE, RULE 8

Pursuant to Uniform Rules of Impoundment Procedure, Rule 8 (Trial Court Rule VIII), it is hereby ordered that:

- (1) the affidavit and application of Massachusetts State Police in support of the aboveentitled arrest warrant;
- (2) the above-entitled arrest warrant; and
- (3) the motion and affidavit in support of this Order

all be impounded, and that those materials be held in the custody of the Office of the Clerk-Magistrate of the Quincy Division of the District Court Department.

After a hearing, the court finds that: (i) good cause exists based on factors, including, but not limited to, the nature of the parties and the controversy, the type of information and the privacy interests involved, the extent of community interest, constitutional rights, and the reason for the impoundment; (ii) the degree, duration, and manner of impoundment ordered by the court are no broader than necessary to protect the interests set forth in (i) above; and (iii) no less restrictive measures are available to protect the interests. Based on its review of the arrest warrant materials and the information set forth in the Commonwealth's motion supported by affidavit, this Court finds good cause for impoundment of those items listed above to protect the following interests: confidentiality of ongoing police investigation, including secrecy of grand

jury; need to prevent destruction of evidence that has not been secured, including testimony of witnesses; and victim's and witnesses' privacy interests.

The Court hereby orders that:

- (1) the materials listed above shall be impounded immediately for a period of 3 months until Friday April 7, 2023; Moscon Co, 2023
- (2) this order is without prejudice to the Commonwealth's right to move to extend the time period of impoundment if good cause arises for further extension of time;
- (3) this matter shall be placed on the list in the Quincy Division of the District Court for Friday April 7, 2023 for determination of whether good cause exists for further extension of impoundment; and
- (4) this Order is not impounded and, upon the return of the warrant, is to be considered a public record available for public inspection.
