

A BILL

- To direct the Comptroller General of the United States to deliver a report on the economic effects of the withdrawal of the United States Armed Forces from Afghanistan, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Big Biden Blunder5 Act" or the "BBB Act".

1SEC. 2. INQUIRY INTO THE EFFECTS OF THE WITHDRAWAL2OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES3FROM AFGHANISTAN ON INFLATION.

4 (a) Report on the Relationship Between
5 Equipment Abandoned in Afghanistan and Infla6 tion.—

7 (1) STUDY.—The Comptroller General of the 8 United States shall conduct a study on the economic 9 effects of the withdrawal of the United States 10 Armed Forces from Afghanistan. Such study shall 11 include a determination of whether destroying, sur-12 rendering, or abandoning equipment and property of 13 the United States in Afghanistan during such with-14 drawal had any inflationary effects in the United 15 States.

16 (2) REPORT.—Not later than 90 days after the
17 date of the enactment of this Act, the Comptroller
18 General of the United States shall submit to Con19 gress a report that includes the findings of the study
20 conducted under paragraph (1).

(b) REQUEST FOR PRESIDENT TO TRANSMIT A
STATEMENT ABOUT THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN
EQUIPMENT ABANDONED IN AFGHANISTAN AND INFLATION.—Not later than 90 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the President is requested to transmit
to Congress a written statement containing the opinion of

2 rendering, or abandoning equipment and property of

3 United States in Afghanistan during the withdrawal of the

4 United States Armed Forces from Afghanistan had any

5 inflationary effects in the United States.
