10	"(1) In general.—A student who is convicted
11	of a hate crime under State or Federal law for con-

13	of higher education that disrupts the normal campus
14	functions at such institution of higher education
15	shall not be eligible, as of the date of such convic-
16	tion—
17	"(A) for any program under this title or
18	any other provision of law that forgives, dis-
19	charges, cancels, or otherwise reduces the
20	amount that the student owes on any loan
21	made, insured, or guaranteed under this title;

23	"(B) to receive any loan made, insured, or
24	guaranteed under this title.

1	"(2) HATE CRIME DEFINED.—The term 'hate
2	crime' includes an act described in section 249 of
3	title 18, United States Code.".
