ARIZONA, GEORGIA, NEVADA, AND NORTH CAROLINA

Methodology

Conducted August 23-26, 2024 under the joint direction of Beacon Research (D) and Shaw & Company Research (R), this Fox News Poll includes interviews with a sample of 4,053 registered voters (RV) in Arizona, Georgia, Nevada, and North Carolina who were randomly selected from a statewide voter file in each state. Respondents spoke with live interviewers on landlines (562) and cellphones (2,530) or completed the survey online by following a link received via text message (961).

Results based on the full sample have a margin of sampling error of ± 1.5 percentage points and ± 3 points for each individual state. Sampling error associated with subgroup results is higher. In addition to sampling error, question wording and order can influence results.

Interviews in Arizona and Nevada were conducted by bilingual interviewers. Respondents were given the option of completing the interview in English or Spanish.

Telephone numbers were randomly selected from a statewide voter file of registered voters in each state using a probability proportionate to size method, which means phone numbers are proportionally representative to the number of voters in all regions across the state.

Telephone fieldwork conducted by Braun Research, Inc. of Princeton, NJ.

When necessary, weights are generally applied to age, race, education, and area variables to ensure the demographics of survey respondents are representative of the registered voter population. Sources for developing weight targets include the American Community Survey, Fox News Voter Analysis, and voter file data.

In the combined results, each state is weighted proportionate to its share of the total number of registered voters across the four states.

Results are of registered voters, unless otherwise noted.

An asterisk (*) is used for percentages of less than one-half percent. A dash (-) represents a value of zero.

Some percentages may not add to 100% due to rounding. In the same way, percentages in "total" columns may be one point more or less than the sum of their parts due to rounding.
