Our Fellow Americans,

We write this in response to the letter that was published and widely circulated this week by other contestants, cast and crew members of *The Apprentice*. We respect their First Amendment right to express support for the candidate of their choice. However, this letter crossed a line when they claimed to represent the viewpoint of the majority of the contestants on *The Apprentice*.

They claim to have spoken to dozens of their fellow contestants to confirm we shared their observations of Trump's character, but mysteriously not a single one of us was contacted by them. Therefore, eleven of us, all former contestants on *The Apprentice*, including a winner and runner-up, are compelled to respond.

It is disappointing and shameful that these contestants would use the platform that Donald Trump gave them to attack him in this manner. Is this the thanks he gets for literally changing the trajectory of our lives?

We don't all share the same beliefs but we all agree on this: based on our own individual interactions with Donald Trump, both on set and in the real world, he is not the man they allege in their letter.

We have a deep and profound respect for Donald Trump, and will be forever grateful to him for the life-changing opportunities that arose from being on *The Apprentice*.
