

1 Magistrate Judge Joel Cano, became effective at 5:00 p.m. on March 21, 2025;

2 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that respondent shall submit duplicate original
3 letters of resignation to the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of New Mexico and
4 the Chief Judge of the Third Judicial District Court and shall concurrently provide
5 a copy to the Judicial Standards Commission;

6 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that respondent shall never again hold,
7 become a candidate for, run for, or stand for election to any New Mexico judicial
8 office in the future;

9 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that respondent shall never seek, accept
10 appointment to, or serve pro tempore for any New Mexico judicial office in the
11 future, which includes the posts of judge in municipal court, probate court,
12 magistrate court, metropolitan court, district court, Court of Appeals, and Justice of
13 the Supreme Court;

14 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that respondent shall never again hold or
15 exercise any judicial authority in the State of New Mexico, to include officiating at
16 weddings;

17 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that all documents filed in this Court in
18 Inquiry Nos. 2023-047, 2023-053, and 2025-048, and in this matter are
19 UNSEALED pursuant to Rule 27-104(B) NMRA; and

20 IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the oral argument set for April 24, 2025,

1 is VACATED.

2 IT IS SO ORDERED.
