OPERATIONS.—Chapter 7 of title 18, United States Code, is amended by adding at the end the following: 3 "§ 119A. Assault on immigration enforcement officers 4 "(a) Whoever knowingly assaults, resists, opposes, 5 impedes, intimidates, or interferes with— 6 "(1) any officer or employee of U.S. Immigra-7 tion and Customs Enforcement, U.S. Customs and 8 Border Protection, or any other Federal immigration 9 enforcement agency; or 10 "(2) any State or local law enforcement officer 11 acting under Federal authority or in active assist-12 ance of Federal immigration enforcement operations 13 in the performance of their official duties, or on ac-14 count of the performance of such duties, 15 shall be fined under this title and imprisoned not less than 5 years and not more than 20 years. 16 17 "(b) If bodily injury results from the acts committed in violation of subsection (a), the term of imprisonment 18 19 shall be not less than 10 years and not more than 30 20 years. 21 "(c) If death results from the acts committed in viola-22 tion of subsection (a), the offender shall be subject to im-23 prisonment for life or the death penalty.". 24 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of sections for chapter 7 of title 18, United States Code, is amended
