Dear Members of the Norwegian Nobel Committee:

We respectfully submit this nomination of President Donald J. Trump for the Nobel Peace Prize, in recognition of his concrete contributions to international fraternity, his leadership in reducing conflict and the risk of war, and his commitment to fostering dialogue as a path toward reconciliation. His decisive leadership in securing landmark diplomatic agreements, de-escalating global conflicts, and actively pursuing peaceful resolutions to some of the world's most entrenched disputes has led and continues to lead to a more peaceful world.

President Trump's tenure—both in his first term as the 45th President of the United States and in his current service as the 47th—has been marked by historic achievements in international diplomacy. Accomplishments from his first term include:

- The Abraham Accords, normalizing relations between Israel and the United Arab Emirates, Bahrain, Sudan, and Morocco—the most significant breakthrough in Middle Eastern diplomacy in a generation;
- The Washington Agreement between Serbia and Kosovo, which advanced economic normalization and broke years of stalemate in the Balkans.
- Unprecedented direct engagement with North Korea, which eased nuclear tensions and established a framework for continued dialogue.

In his current term, President Trump has continued to advance peace through active and results-driven diplomacy:


- Brokering a peace agreement between Armenia and Azerbaijan at the White House, aiming to end decades of armed conflict and displacement in the South Caucasus;
- Engaging directly with regional leaders on the Gaza conflict, to bring about the release of hostages, the delivery of humanitarian aid without the empowerment of terrorists, and to seek an end to the conflict that ensures a durable peace;
- Fostering dialogue to deescalate the conflict between Russia and Ukraine, including by:

- Hosting a high-stakes summit with President Vladimir Putin in Alaska on August 15, 2025, focused on establishing a path towards a Ukraine ceasefire, prisoner exchanges, humanitarian corridors, and future security arrangements—a significant step in reopening direct, constructive dialogue.
- Hosting a meeting with President Volodymyr Zelenskyy and numerous other European leaders on August 18, 2025, to discuss security guarantees for Ukraine and facilitating a discussion between Presidents Zelenskyy and Putin to bring about a just and lasting peace in the region.

President Trump's foreign policy reflects a consistent philosophy: that peace is best secured through strength, clarity, and direct engagement. He has shown a unique ability to bring adversaries to the table, to create openings where diplomacy had long failed, to achieve tangible outcomes while avoiding large-scale new U.S. troop deployments, and to bring greater fraternity among nations historically at odds with one another.

For his bold and ongoing pursuit of peace, his proven record of successful negotiation, and his willingness to engage directly in the resolution of active conflicts, we commend President Donald J. Trump to your most serious consideration for the Nobel Peace Prize.
