SUPERSEDING BILL OF PARTICULARS

Now comes the Assistant Prosecuting Attorney on behalf of the State of Ohio who, pursuant to Criminal Rule 7(E), hereby provides the defendant with a Bill of Particulars setting up the specific nature of the underlying offense(s) charged and the code of conduct of the defendant alleged to constitute the offense(s):

On August 7, 2025, a parent of victim, CF dob 8/20/2023 age 2, contacted the Licking County Sheriff's Office to advise that she was contacted by Director Jamie Schoelkopf from Over the Rainbow Children Center located 101 Lois Lane Southwest in Pataskala, Licking County, Ohio advising that an employee of the daycare, Defendant Katelyn Strohacker, had bound and left CF in a bed for an hour on July 21, 2025. The ensuing investigation revealed that the Defendant placed painter's tape on CF's eyes, taped CF's hands behind her back, and taped CF's feet together, leaving CF face down under a blanket unattended. The Defendant was subsequently interviewed and admitted to doing these acts on that occasion, as well as one prior occasion. Detectives continued to investigate the Defendant's behavior by reviewing voluminous amounts of video from her prior shifts dating back to a surveillance retention date of July 7, 2025 and video up to August 7, 2025. Law enforcement discovered that the Defendant had done this on at least four prior occasions to CF, including one incident on July 17, 2025, in which she taped CF's hands behind her head and stepped her foot on CF's shoulder and neck area. After the first four incidents, the Defendant released CF by removing the tape. During the incident with CF on July 21, 2025, CF was freed only after a co-worker of the Defendant removed the tape.

Law enforcement observed in the videos the Defendant committing acts of abuse against CF and seven other children between July 7, 2025 and August 7, 2025. These acts include pushing, kicking, yanking, and yelling in a threatening manner at all eight victims. One particular victim, AF (dob 10/26/2023 age 2) received a bulk of the mistreatment. The Defendant frequently shoved or yanked AF, including one incident on July 11, 2025 where the Defendant purposely shut the victim's finger in a cabinet door. These acts of abuse occurred on July 7, 8, 10, 11, 16, 17, 18, 25, 28, 29, and 31, 2025, as well as August 1, 4, and 7, 2025.

Four of the victims were seen, evaluated, and treated by multi-disciplinary teams at Nationwide Children's Hospital. These children, who suffered serious physical harm as a result of the Defendant's abuse, have experienced sleep issues/night terrors, separation anxiety, and behavioral issues. These victims received psychological evaluations and some were referred for recommended mental health counseling. The Defendant had been working at Over The Rainbow Children Center for over three years in this capacity, and had received all necessary training and continuing education.

As a result, the Defendant is charged in Count 1 of the Indictment with Kidnapping a violation of Revised Code section 2905.01 (A)(3). This is a felony of the 2nd degree which carries a minimum prison term of two (2) years with a maximum prison term of eight (8) years and a maximum fine of \$15,000.

She is charged in Count 2 of the Indictment with Endangering children a violation of Revised Code section 2919.22 (B)(3). This is a felony of the 3rd Degree which carries a maximum prison term of three (3) years and a maximum fine of \$10,000.

She is charged in Count 3 of the Indictment with Kidnapping a violation of Revised Code section 2905.01 (A)(3). This is a felony of the 2nd degree which carries a minimum prison term of two (2) years with a maximum prison term of eight (8) years and a maximum fine of \$15,000.




