A BILL

To prohibit aliens who are nationals of certain countries
of identified concern from entering the United States,
and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Third World Immigra-
5 tion Moratorium Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON ENTRY FOR NATIONALS OF COUN-**
2 **TRIES OF IDENTIFIED CONCERN.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subject to section 3, an alien who
4 is a national of any of the following countries may not
5 enter the United States:

- 20 (b) OTHER PROHIBITED INDIVIDUALS.—Subject to
- 21 section 3, an alien possessing travel documents issued by
- 22 the Palestinian Authority may not enter the United
- 23 States.

1 **SEC. 3. APPLICABILITY.**

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—This Act shall apply only to an
3 alien who—

4 (1) is outside of the United States on the date
5 of enactment of this Act; and

6 (2) has not be issued a valid visa on such date.

7 (b) EXCEPTIONS.—This Act shall not apply to an
8 alien who—

9 (1) is a lawful permanent resident;

10 (2) is a dual national of a country designated
11 under section 2 and a national of a country not so
12 designated;

13 (3) has nonimmigrant status under subpara-
14 graph (A), (C), or (G) of section 101(a)(15) of the
15 Immigration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
16 1101(a)(15)) or pursuant to a treaty with the North
17 Atlantic Treaty Organization;

18 (4) is an athlete or member of an athletic team,
19 including the coaches, persons performing a nec-
20 essary support role, and immediate relatives, trav-
21 eling for the World Cup, Olympics, or other major
22 sporting event, as determined by the Secretary of
23 State;

24 (5) is a special immigrant under paragraph
25 (27)(D) of section 101(a) of the Immigration and
26 Nationality Act (8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(27)); or

1 (6) has an immigrant visa due to ethnic and re-
2 ligious persecution in Iran.

3 (c) CASE BY CASE-BY-CASE DETERMINATIONS.—The
4 Secretary of Homeland Security, in coordination with the
5 Secretary of State and the Attorney General, may waive
6 the prohibition under section 2 if the Secretary of Home-
7 land finds, in his discretion, that an alien’s entry into the
8 United States would advance a critical national interest,
9 including when individuals must be present to participate
10 in criminal proceedings as witnesses.

11 **SEC. 4. REPORT ON ADJUSTMENTS TO PROHIBITION.**

12 Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment
13 of this Act, and every 180 days thereafter, the Secretary
14 of State, in consultation with the Attorney General, the
15 Secretary of Homeland Security, and the Director of the
16 National Intelligence, shall submit to Congress a report—

17 (1) providing a recommendation on whether the
18 prohibition under section 2 should be continued, ter-
19 minated, modified, or supplemented; and

20 (2) on any case with respect to which an excep-
21 tion applied under section 3.

22 **SEC. 5. SEVERABILITY.**

23 If any provision of this Act, or the application of any
24 provision of this Act to any person or circumstance, is held
25 to be invalid, the remainder of this Act and the application

1 of its other provisions to any other persons or cir-
2 cumstances shall not be affected thereby.
